The staff at Camp Sunset look forward to your dog having a good time while staying with us. We thank you for allowing us to share this time with your dog. We know that sometimes your pet can experience different play styles, temperaments, or behaviors and we try to intercept situations that may arise. Prior to your dog interacting with other dogs, we must first have the opportunity to get acquainted with him/her. This will require an assessment by our staff and will also be an ongoing evaluation each time your dog visits us. You know your dog much better than we do and we would like you to be our first judge of your dog's behavior. **Let us know of any issues, likes/dislikes, aggressive tendencies, fears, territorial boundaries, or dominant behaviors that you are aware of or have witnessed in your dog's behavior with other dogs or people.** This information is important to consider in our assessment process and we would much rather know prior to introducing your dog into the pack than find out later. Some dogs prefer small play groups and others prefer to have much bigger parties; so this will be an important factor regarding the group your dog is most comfortable with.

Again, we want this to be a positive social experience for all our Campers. **To assist with this becoming a fun socializing time for your dog, we highly recommend regular exercise outside of daycamp.** We want all daycamper parents to remember daycamp is for your dog to gain socialization skills; daycamp shouldn't be your dog's only or main source of exercise. When our daycampers are exercised regularly, and for some high energy breeds before coming in, they will have more positive experiences here.

The services we provide are done so without liability for loss or damage from disease, injury, bacterial/viral/parasitic infections, running away, or from injury or damage done by your pet to people, other animals or property; or from other unavoidable causes. Due diligence and care has been exercised. Should any pet become ill, injured or need medical attention, we reserve the right to administer aid and to render care by our veterinarian once reasonable attempts have been made to contact you at the phone number(s) you have provided. Any expenses incurred shall be paid promptly by the owner.
